

CONTRACTOR

Every month the Arboricultural Association is giving away a free ARB Approved Contractor assessment (usually £495+VAT) and two halfprice assessments.

Entry rules (see also introduction on page 2)

Your business must

- 1. be nominated by a local authority tree officer
- 2. not exceed 5 people (inc. the employer)
- 3. have a competent Manager (with min. 5 years industry experience)
- 4. have appropriate insurance (inc. £5million PL)
- 5. have been trading for a minimum of two years
- 6. be assessed on the specified date.

Winners will be drawn the day after close of nominations. First prize free assessment, second and third prizes, half price assessments.

NB Annual scheme subs will still be payable plus any follow up visits

ARB Approved Contractor Scheme



Get ARB Approved for FREE

Nomination form for use by Local Authority Officers

Introduction: In order to nominate a small business arb contractor who operates in your local authority area

- 1. The contractor you are nominating must agree to be nominated by you
- 2. You need to be reasonably satisfied they are of a good standard in the following areas
 - Completed work quality (tree pruning and tree planting)
 - Safe, competent and proficient operations (tree dismantling/rigging)
 - Underpinning arboricultural knowledge (to a reasonable level but assistance will be offered)
 - Compliance with current H&S procedures and practices (assistance will be offered here as required but the contractor is expected to have a generally positive H&S culture and awareness)
 - A focus on good customer care and practices
 - A suitably adequate office (can be home based) and administration structure.
